Is PPS evolving? When something evolves, it gradually changes or develops over time. Things usually evolve to improve chances of survival so one hopes that change for PPS means that things will gradually improve for members.

The PPS executive has made several changes this year. One of the most evident was to try using a microphone. This was done when some members provided feedback that they had trouble hearing Speakers at the front of the room. I was personally thanked by a member for using the microphone because this person indicated it greatly improved his experience at PPS meetings. One of our visitors this year was from The Canadian Hearing Society and he congratulated us for using a microphone to meet the needs of members who required this accommodation.

Another change tried by the executive was to introduce the idea of workshops and discussion groups so that members could share their interests and passion with others to foster discussion and exchange of ideas and experiences. This has resulted in sessions on portraits and studio work, macro photography and sharing of videos for beginners.

Hopefully this will inspire others to introduce additional topics of interest for other discussion sessions. This ties in directly with the PPS vision of fostering skills among our community of photographers. It also brings together beginning photographers with more experienced members who have a wealth of experience and interesting stories to share.

More recently, the executive has made some changes in the number of images members may submit monthly as well as the manner in which image reviews are presented. This started because one of the meetings went too long and the executive was attempting to speed things up. With additional discussion among executive members, it was decided to increase the number of images for Photographer's Choice and Theme but to decrease the number of images for Outings. The result is that you now have more freedom when submitting some of your images. For example, if you have more than three outing images you really want to show, you can put some of them in Photographer's Choice. Image reviews will be done with videos for the next little while and your feedback is appreciated.

We know that not all changes that happen in life are for the better. As the PPS executive strive to improve the quality of experiences for members it's important that you provide feedback to help us make proper choices. We are also getting close to the time when you can consider joining the executive so that you can provide more direct input on the direction PPS takes. Important areas will be financial and secretarial as some people are considering changing portfolios. Please consider joining the executive at the May meeting to help PPS evolve positively! ## February Guest Speaker: Cydnee Hosker



Cydnee Hosker, the guest speaker at the February PPS meeting, presented an approach to photography that was both unique and fascinating. A visual arts teacher at Thomas A. Stewart Secondary School,

she encourages students to push their creativity using a variety of alternative photographic techniques such as cyanotype, pinhole, caffenol, and polaroid transfers. Cydnee's presentation, which featured both her own images and those of her students, demonstrated their striking difference from more conventional types of photos.

Cydnee has been an art teacher for 30 years and her enthusiasm for using these unusual techniques to foster her students' artistic instincts came through very strongly in her presentation. She discussed how the students work on photographic projects and assignments in the classroom and on outings and photo shoots. They also have the opportunity to display their work to the public thanks to Natas Café on George St., which has allowed the students to set up a permanent exhibition on one of its walls.

"Art should not be created and isolated in a classroom," Hosker commented in an article in the Peterborough Examiner. She said this opportunity has helped students learn important skills in presenting their work to the public.

People seldom see me about, but I populate their dreams; They conceive strange notions when they hear my hoots and screams. Some think I inhabit the deepest, dark corners of the forest, Inhabited by spirits that haunt the richest and the poorest. Hoo, ho-hoo, hoo, my calls resonate nightly, More often, and from higher perches, when the moon shines brightly. Some think my call sounds like, "You still up? Me, too". Our medley of calls from hoots to squawks will surely startle you. In February my calling presents my mate with an tempting sight -My bulging, white bib is a beacon reflecting moonlight. My bigger half will mate with me; then we'll find a suitable nest site. She'll lay about two white eggs, and for thirty-some days sit tight. I don't call as frequently now as our family life will soon begin. You may only notice us at the nest by our ear-tufted heads within. Of North American birds, we're one of the earliest to nest. Hunting for her and our chicks now leaves me little time to rest. If you intrude into our domain, you may see my yellow-eyed stare, And I might launch an aerial attack of which you must beware.

The deadline for submitting your images is always midnight the Friday night before the meeting. To submit, you must now e-mail your images to a new e-mail address:

Before doing so:

- they must be named and resized as instructed below.
- images must be in JPEG format
- please ensure your images are sent as an attachment with your e mail

When re-sizing your horizontal or landscape JPG image, re-size the width to 1024 pix, and let the height adjust automatically.

When re sizing vertical or portrait JPG images, adjust the height to 768 pix, and let the width adjust automatically.
