Program Notes By Guy Ridgway

January's Speaker

To ring in the New Year, Randall Romano returns to talk about "Documentary Street Photography".

Those who experienced Randall's motivational November talk, "Creating Meaningful Photographs", know him to be a fascinating speaker with a deep passion for his craft.

In comparison to landscape or studio work, street photography seems to offer the least amount of control and relies on timing and serendipity with little or no command over most aspects of the photographic process. It often requires the artist to become intimately one with the subjects and the environment in a way quite unlike that required for any other photographic genre. This, many agree, makes street photography just about the most challenging photographic style.

In Randall's own words —

"The simple act of making a street photograph including people is both a brave and mindful gesture. The photographer is forced to visualize and do at the same time in order to instinctively create a meaningful image. The photographs are an honest interpretation of events being uncensored and not scripted. They are essentially unique moments in time. As an observer the photographer is in a privileged situation, being able to see and photograph these fleeting junctures."


