

President's Message What's Your Style?

When we talk about a photographic style, we generally refer to how a photographer's finished product looks, so that you tend to recognize the photographer by her style.

But I want to use "style" to describe the thinking you put into your craft and how you arrive at certain ways of working with your camera – it's about your "process". Often, you might apply a different style depending on the genre you're dealing with, i.e., landscape, architecture, street, macro, wildlife, portraits, etc.

It's about your habits and ways of thinking when you decide to capture an image. This is what a photographer often finds interesting about other photographers (well, at least I do). It goes beyond the technical aspects of shot-taking, i.e., settings for aperture, shutter speed, ISO, filters, flash, Manual vs. Auto, etc.

This makes me think of different style types:

Walk-about – often a specific location. Spontaneous, but perhaps with a "vision" of the result. Never without your camera. Carry one or two zoom lenses. Maybe a tripod. Polarizing filter, perhaps [Think of Dave Brosha: visit a beach and find 10 things to photograph]

Premeditated – plan each image. Scout the location before hand. Spend time in set-up and execution. Take several lenses, ND and GND filters, intervalometer. Do some groundwork before you leave home.

Casual – shoot from the hip. Spontaneous. No strong, prior "vision". Unplanned locations or compositions. It's whatever you come across, but using your photographic eye to capture an interesting moment or scene. Take a single zoom lens, or use a compact camera with fixed zoom, or cell phone. Leave the tripod at home. No filters. Think street photography.

Procedural – use a well-defined set of step-by-step instructions to be followed for any photograph. Think studio session or astrophotography (and post processing). A tripod is a must.

Not to imply there are no overlaps. You can be somewhat Premeditated while being somewhat Casual

What's my style?

For landscapes, I'm the **Premeditated** type. I'll ...

Think about the area or location where I want to shoot.

Take my complete kit, plus tripod.

Create a "vision" of how the image should turn out. Therefore, consider the quality and direction of the light, depending on time of day, direction, etc.

Run a mental walk-through to try to anticipate problems before I set out.

Consult *The Photographer's Ephemeris* or *PhotoPills* to ensure the full moon, or the Milky Way, or the sunrise / sunset aligns with my preferred foreground.

For studio still life, I'm definitely **Procedural**. I'll follow the steps I learned in my still life courses to the letter, every time. I have a detailed "vision" of the end result and I spend an exorbitant amount of time on composition and post processing.

What's your style" I'm interested. It might be one, or none, of the above. Send me your thoughts and we can discuss things in a future "**Let's Talk Photography**" Zoom session, over a cup of joe. PPSPrograms@gmail.com.

Image Submission Guidelines by Terry Carpenter

Members can submit up to three images each for monthly theme, and six images for photographers choice, and up to three images for each outing. Please note that the Theme images should be shot within the current year of the club.

Outing images submitted must be from the current outing and from the same day as the outing. Due to risks of COVID-19, outings may be scheduled for weekdays. During the pandemic, if you are working or have other commitments for the scheduled day, you can shoot the outing images at your leisure. However, they still must be from the chosen location and shot within the week (7 days) after the original assigned outing date. If you have images from a previous outing, they can be submitted into the PC category. Images must be submitted by the <u>Tuesday Midnight</u> before the monthly meeting. Images submitted after this time may not be shown.

Before submitting your images Please title and re-size as instructed below. Images must be in JPEG. We prefer that the images be down-sized, but if there is a problem with down-sizing just send them in full size and they will be sized before going into the slide show.

Re-sizing your images:

Images must be submitted in JPEG format. It is recommended, but not mandatory, that images be re-sized according to the following standards:

If the image is landscape orientation (width greater than height), re-size the width to be 1024 px and allow the height to adjust automatically.

If the image is portrait orientation (height greater than width), re-size the height to be 768 px and allow the width to adjust automatically.

If the image is square, re-size it to 1,024 px on any side.

After re-sizing them, give each image a simple title, such as Lift locks At Sunset. **DO NOT ADD YOUR NAME**. The new system will automatically put your name onto the image for presentation.

To submit your images please go to http://www.peterboroughphotographicsociety.com/ then to Home and then to Image Submission. The first thing you will see on this page is Preparing Images for Club Slideshow. Please click on this to find out all the information for submitting images.

Image Submission Guidelines Continued

Now go back to the Image Submission page. Scrolling down the page you will see all the Categories we use. Theme, Photographers Choice, Breakfast Outing, Outing, Members Slideshows, and Miscellaneous Files. Here you will also see a brief description of each category.

You will see each category highlighted in blue. This will be the link to click on to submit your images. Click on the blue link and this will take you to a Dropbox page asking you to choose your files. Click this icon and it will open a page where you can select the images you wish to submit (you do not need a Dropbox account and do not need to Sign In to Drop-box). Please do not attempt to submit folders of images, even though Dropbox presents that as an option.

Highlight your selected images and click on "Open" at the bottom right hand corner of the pop-up. This will direct you to a page showing you which category you have selected, show you the images you have selected, and ask you for your name and e-mail. After typing this information click on Upload at the bottom of the page. And that is all there is to it. I know in print it sounds like a lot, but in reality it is very quick and smooth. Now, close the page and go to the next category and repeat the instructions.

If you would rather have the Dropbox Links on your desktop instead of going to the website please see instructions below or go to https://youtu.be/FoOfCviPuSk to see a short video.

PLACING DROPBOX ICONS ON THE DESKTOP

- 1 Go to the PPS website and go to the IMAGE SUBMISSIONS on the left hand side then go to DROPBOX LINKS FOR IMAGE SUBMISSION.
- 2 Proceed down the page to one of the blue highlighted links such as THEMES OR PHOTOGRAPHERS CHOICE etc..
- 3 Click on the blue highlighted link. This will now take you to the Dropbox website. No need to click on any of the buttons.
- 4 At the top of the page in the URL box you will see something like https://www.dropbox.com/request/bPYd3c9adqfXlofHT2

HIGHLIGHT AND COPY THE ADDRESS IN THE URL BOX.

- 5 Almost done. Now go to your desktop and RIGHT CLICK ON A BLANK AREA. In the drop-down menu GO TO NEW AND THEN TO SHORTCUT. A BOX WILL POP UP called **Type the location of the item** PASTE THE COPIED URL IN THIS BOX AND THEN HIT NEXT.
- 6 NOW IT WILL ASK YOU TO TYPE A NAME FOR THIS SHORTCUT. TYPE IN THE NAME YOU WOULD LIKE FOR THE SHORTCUT SUCH AS THEME OR PC ETC. Now click on finish.
- 7 Go to your desktop and you will now see a new icon titled THEME etc. If you click on this it will take you to the appropriate Dropbox location where you can now submit your images.
- 8 Repeat the above instructions for the rest of the PPS themes.

Please make sure the pictures you send are placed into the correct Dropbox category. Images sent in the wrong Dropbox will automatically be placed into the category to which you have sent them.
