This represents a significant milestone and completely resolves some upgrade and security issues with our previous website. It is very much a work in progress and will remain that way for some time.

The site has been created at no cost to the club. It is the culmination of a great deal of work by a dedicated team of volunteers. Hiring a professional website designer could have run into thousands of dollars.

Please join us on Tuesday, February 7, at 7:00 PM to hear our very own Terry Carpenter discuss a simple solution to the bane of some photographers: image handling organization, followed by an instructional YouTube video. Watch for your Zoom invitation by e-mail.

Terry's presentation is titled: "Photographic Storage and File Management"

Initially self-taught, Terry has become a dedicated and accomplished photographer since 1978. Most of his images are taken in Algonquin Park, throughout other parts of Ontario, as well as in the local areas around Peterborough where he resides.

Terry has presented several slide shows and nature workshops around Ontario. These have been favourable received by various clubs and groups, and have appeared at such venues as Silent Lake Provincial Park, Algonquin Provincial Park, and the Syracuse Camera Club.

His images have been published in brochures, magazines, coffee table books, and calendars. He has successfully exhibited his work at various art shows, including the Buckhorn and Kawarth Art Festivals. His prints are now displayed in homes and offices in Brazil, throughout Canada and the USA, Great Britain, and Europe.

Terry's approximately half hour-long presentation will begin at 7:00 PM, followed by a Q&A period.

Topic Synopsis:

"Some members will already have their images filed using different forms of software, but if you are a new photographer or one of those people with images scattered all over their computer, then this may be of help to you.

I will be speaking on creating a simple, but efficient system I use that allows me to search and find almost any images I have stored on my computer. I started using this method back in 2003 when I switched to digital photography and have been using it ever since. It will require no downloading and installing of any software, as basically it is using any version of the Windows operating system. I would imagine Mac users have the same type of filing system. I will also be speaking on how to back up your files to external hard drives using a free software called FreeFileSync."


