

The September 9th outing will be at Chisholm"s Mills located near the village of Roslin, Ontario. Roslin is just about central north of Belleville and south of Tweed, and approximately one hour and 20 minutes from Peterborough. I will provide maps nearer the date.

Chisholm's Mills was a water-powered lumber mill on the Moira River. It was constructed in 1851 and bought by William Fraser Chisholm in 1857, leading to the creation of the Chisholm Lumber Company.

MEET AT 10:30 AM IN THE PARKING LOT ACROSS THE BRIDGE


For those interested, I plan on giving a short basic demonstration on how to use a 10 stop ND filter for a long exposure using the mill and fast water as an example. For those interested, you will need a 10stop ND filter, a tripod, and a remote shutter release.

To make the procedure easier, download to your phone one of these apps for a way of calculating your times for long exposure: LEE BIG STOPPER or ND EXPERT. I will also provide a printed calculator at a later date.

If you are new to this and just wish to try it out, purchase an inexpensive ND filter to fit the lens size you plan on using. These can be found on Amazon for as low as \$30.

FALL COLOURS ALONG THE LIFT LOCK CANAL






















