Flash is allowed, but tripods are not recommended. Please be respectful of other visitors. Please note that there is no elevator and the second floor is only available by stairs. There are interesting pictures outside as well as the inside of the building, especially the old oak door.

The Victoria County Gaol (jail) was built in 1863 at the same time as the court house, after Victoria County separated from Peterborough County.

Judging and showing of the winners will be at the PPS meeting on April 2nd, 2024. Judges will be you, the members. This will be a fun night when you, the members, will decide on the final winners of 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and Honourable Mention in the two categories.

For the judging, images shown will not have the member's name, just the slide title. Slight modifications to your image are allowed to enhance the overall visual appeal of the photograph. Permitted modifications include adjustments to brightness, contrast, saturation, cropping, straightening and minor retouching (removal of dust spots, etc.).

Not allowed: heavy digital manipulations, such as adding or removing significant elements, compositing multiple images, or AI (artificial intelligence) photography.






